



In 2023, 187 CASA volunteers served 409 children. 124 cases closed. Of those cases:

- 36% were reunified with their parents
- 26% were adopted
- 19% achieved guardianship
- 14% aged out of foster care
- 5% custody granted with relative

REASONS FOR ENTERING FOSTER CARE IN 2023




\$186,114 RAISED

Our Stars raised record numbers at this year's Dancing with Savannah Stars. Our top dancer and volunteer, Sally Helm, raised a whopping \$33,417.




Pictured Above: Dancing with Savannah Stars 2023

Since launching, Bright House has served 55 families and 720 supervised visitation sessions. Bright House Family Support Specialists provide parental coaching before and after each supervised visitation.

60 BRIGHT HOUSE REFERRALS
